

Currently the following poems are being sung for him: "Abu Dhabi manifested", "Fly high dear banner as we raid", and "My home is where my flag raised high". most notable of which are: "Confession" (which has been listed as one of the hundred best Arabic novels of the twentieth century); "The Sword and the Flower"; "Ashes of Blood"; "Window of Madness"; "Idol Hill"; "The Majbal bin Shahwan Duology "; "Salayem"; "The Soul and Stone Duology"; "The Statue"; "The Body, Water and Soil Trilogy"; "Room 357" and "The Queen's Accessories".

39th anniversary of the Union

The Abu Dhabi Authority for Culture and Heritage (ADACH) is organizing a variety of celebrations and events to mark the occasion of the thirty-ninth anniversary of the UAE's Union, led by His Highness late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, may God rest his soul.

Sheikh Zayed formed a clear national approach and a comprehensive strategy that focused on strengthening the unity amongst the Emirates. His Highness Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, the President of the UAE followed in his father Sheikh Zayed's footsteps.

The events represent the official participation of various local departments and private institutions from within the Emirate of Abu Dhabi, as well as from civil society institutions. The events will be held between the 2nd and 4th December in the Abu Dhabi Corniche and Heritage Village located in the Emirati capital. ADACH will host an evening operetta and concert at the Corniche theatre, as well as shows performed by Emirati folk groups, including "al ayyala, al harbia, rawah, nadbah, liouh, and al habban."

Culture and Heritage ... and the accomplishments continue

The Abu Dhabi Authority for Culture and Heritage (ADACH) celebrated the fifth anniversary of its establishment in October 2010. The celebrations included the launch of a number of vital and important projects. Over the past five years the Authority has made one significant achievement after another. It has done this by working to conserve and promote the tangible and intangible heritage of the region.

Among these achievements was the rehabilitation project aimed at rejuvenating the museums and castles of the UAE, including the Qasr Al Hosn, which is considered to be the spiritual symbol of Abu Dhabi, signifying its cultural process into the future. Another rehabilitation project was the Al Jahili Fort, which has won a number of international awards. These special projects of ADACH have also won many other awards.

ADACH has also submitted the final dossier for the registration of falconry onto UNESCO's World Heritage List. This achievement is in addition to its promotion of other heritage sites that seek to introduce the civilization of Abu Dhabi to a regional and international audience. The Authority has been able to show the heritage of the UAE to a wide European audience, with the introduction of the Heritage Village at an international festival of falconry in Britain.

Other successful projects include: the National Library; Kalima, the most important translation initiative in the Arab World; the Abu Dhabi International Book Fair, which successfully changed the concept of book fairs in the Arab world; Qalam, which aims to encourage the creativity of UAE authors and promote their literary works; and the Sheikh Zayed Book Award, a prestigious and independent prize aimed at publicizing the works of talented and innovative authors in the fields of knowledge, arts and humanities, which has become known for its discovery of pioneering works.

The Authority has also contributed to the cultural enrichment of the region with projects like the Abu Dhabi Film Festival, WOMAD, Sound of Arabia, Bait Al Oud (House of Lute), the Liwa Dates Festival, the Al Dhafra Festival, and Abu Dhabi Classics. All of these projects strengthen the identity, as well the expertise, of the region. They also promote UAE culture in the fields of literature, music, poetry and film.



These accomplishments have given ADACH a prestigious and highly acclaimed reputation both locally and internationally. The Authority was recently selected by Newsweek as the best, most unique and innovative Arab cultural institution. The magazine's prize committee applauded ADACH's creative cultural work, and its role in maintaining and enhancing the heritage of the UAE.

The Authority is famous for its global cultural agenda and its five-year strategy, which began in 2007. This strategy has been implemented in accordance with the directives of the Abu Dhabi Government, and was made under the influence of a very wise leadership. ADACH actively seeks the promotion of culture and national identity, and believes that it should be a source of pride and inspiration for all people. Despite the changes that accompany Abu Dhabi's continuous progress, the Authority continues its work to ensure the continued preservation of Abu Dhabi's heritage and culture. It aims to encourage new generations to participate in its programs in Al Ain City, Al Gharbia (the Western Region) and other areas of the Emirate, which has unique natural, architectural and human characteristics.

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The opening ceremony of Qasr Al Hosn's Cultural Quarter Hall in Abu Dhabi

Abu Dhabi Authority for Culture and Heritage (ADACH) launched its first activity at the Qasr Al Hosn Cultural Quarter Hall this November which coincides with the celebration of its 5th year Anniversary and all the achievements and contributions ADACH has made to Arab culture in the field of intangible and tangible heritage and culture across the region.

The Cultural Quarter Hall was inaugurated by holding a lecture on the role of urban design in revitalising Abu Dhabi, two Professors from Harvard University, Jorge Silvetti and Felipe Correa spoke about a book that was jointly produced by ADACH and Harvard University.

Mohammed Khalaf Al Mazrouei, the Advisor for Culture and Heritage at the Court of the Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi, and Director General of ADACH, announced the opening of the Cultural Hall, in the historical heart of the Emirate of Abu Dhabi, and within the Qasr Al Hosn plan, that is currently being developed, ensuring ADACH's efforts to develop a contemporary Emirati culture proud of its identity, and open to dialogue across the region.

Mazrouei stated that ADACH's cultural strategy 2008-2012 had been developed in line with the requirements of the Government of Abu Dhabi, which has contributed in promoting and ensuring that Abu Dhabi retains and strengthens it's position on the cultural map. Creating a centre for major events and cultural and artistic activities, and a destination for artists and creators from around the world through the mobility of cultural and artistic excellence.

Qasr Al Hosn's Cultural Quarter Hall will be experiencing a rich programme of events in the near future, this will include lectures, seminars, conferences, art exhibitions, archaeology, urban planning, architecture, films, music, poetry, contemporary art, photography, and many other disciplines in the field of arts, heritage and culture.

This first activity introduced a valuable lecture which focused on the book published by ADACH in cooperation with Harvard University, which is a significant publication in terms of its contribution to research relating to maintaining the architectural character of the area, it is entitled "Invention/Transformation: Strategies for the Qattara/Jimi Oases in Al Ain." This achievement shows the commitment that is undertaken by the ADACH, to make Abu Dhabi the centre of research and knowledge production, in collaboration with internationally renowned academic institutions.







Dr. Sami el Masri, Deputy Director General for Arts, Culture and Heritage at ADACH and Director of Strategic Planning and Development Department introduced the lecturers and pointed out that the book was the fruit of research and hard work undertaken by the Graduate School of Urban Planning and Design students at Harvard University on Al Qattara and Jimi Oases in Al Ain.

The Harvard team that consisted of a team of twentyfive was led by the Architects Jorge Silvetti, Professor of Architecture, and Felipe Correa, Assistant Professor of Urban Design. The team included experienced graduates from three different disciplines within the faculty: Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Urban Design. They worked together in an innovative cross-disciplinary framework in order to discover alternative visions for sites that are unique from a cultural and an ecological perspective.

This book presents the findings of the Harvard team's visit to Abu Dhabi, which included the exchange of experiences with local experts from ADACH and other scientific institutions and the research work done later in their college exploring scenarios and strategies for the restructuring of Qattara and Jimi Oases.

Masri said that this cooperation emerged from the urgent need to develop methodologies for designing and developing a centre for Al Ain's oases, which are a crucial element of Abu Dhabi's heritage. He went on to say it was important to integrate these oases in the social and urban structure of the city while maintaining and preserving their heritage value. This is why the Urban Design team from Harvard and ADACH experts worked hard to explore the best ways to make the necessary changes while ensuring the preservation of the oases characteristics.

The development of the Qattara and Jimi Oases is a continuation of the Abu Dhabi project on the implementation of an important cultural, educational and research programme in these unique sites. This programme will be devoted to the study, production and development of arts, handicrafts and the tradition of design in the UAE and abroad.

The 2nd Al Ain Reads Book Show concludes on a high note as over 6000

students and hundreds of book-lovers visit the show!

The 7-day Al Ain Reads Book Show concluded on 23 October 2010 with hundreds and thousands of book lovers enjoying a week of storytelling, arts and crafts activities, tales of Emirati folklore, piano performances and BookExchange. The week-long event saw 122 school buses come through bringing in over 6000 enthusiastic book lovers from schools in Al Ain and neighbouring Sultanate of Oman. Activities such as 'how to make a scrapbook', 'making your own reading box' and many more had the Creativity Corner packed to capacity each day with students keen to learn and experiment.

Hundreds of thousands of visitors to the Al Ain Reads were entertained by Emirati authors and their story telling as well as piano performances. The mall atrium and main stage was brimming with avid readers as Ghaya Al Dhaheri read from her stories focusing on Emirati culture and heritage. And story-telling wasn't the only crowd puller during the event. The audiences were entranced by performances by the Emirati pianists Sarah Al Kaabi, Asala Al Jaberi, Saif Al Jahory and Mariam and Sheikha Al Kaabi. The show drew to a close with a 2-day weekend BookExchange event where book-lovers could swap their old books for a new one. This year, KITAB partnered with the Red Crescent Society and for visitors who didn't have an old book to swap – they could happily make a small donation and take a new book. The BookExchange counter started with a stock of more than 550 books ranging from Arabic and English titles, while, over 500 books were brought in to be exchanged by the visitors. The exchange closed on Saturday with over 150 books remaining which were donated to the Higher College of technology library. The College has expressed interest in hosting a similar event at their campus in collaboration with KITAB in the future.

Meanwhile, 29 exhibitors from across the Emirate of Abu Dhabi displayed their products, building on the new opportunity to access a wider market for their books. The show was a positive opportunity for the book-stores and exhibitors to reach the audience and showcase their publications to schools, libraries and parents alike.

ADACH hosts Sorbonne Planning Students in Al Ain

Students and faculty of the Professional Master Degree in Urban and Regional Planning at Sorbonne University – Abu Dhabi were hosted by ADACH for a field trip in Al Ain, on 23rd October. The trip was part of the course on cultural heritage, taught by Dr. Celine Pouyat.

The class of 15 included male and female students, the majority of which are Emirati and working as architecture and planning professionals in Abu Dhabi. The trip began with presentations made by staff of ADACH and Al Ain Municipality.

Ege Yildirim of the ADACH Strategic Planning and Development Department presented 'Oasis Master Planning for Heritage Conservation in Al Ain', which addressed the planned conservation and redevelopment of the Al Ain Oasis and surrounding urban area. Dr. Hossam Mahdy of the ADACH Conservation Department, with his presentation 'Conservation of Historic Buildings: What? Why? And How?' introduced the students to fundamental concepts of conservation practice and theory. They were joined by Stephen Goldie, Advisor to Al Ain Municipality, who presented an historical overview of Al Ain.

This was followed by site visits to Al Ain Oasis and the sites of the Al Ain Oasis Cultural Quarter Master Plan, where issues relating to the urban edges of oases were discussed; to historic earthen buildings being treated under the ADACH Emergency Conservation Program and the Qattara Community Arts Center project, where types of interventions to heritage sites were discussed. The trip was the setting for intensely productive exchanges and a good step that reinforced the commitment to partnership between ADACH and Sorbonne University. ADACH places great emphasis on education, for both professionals and the public, to raise capacity and awareness for protecting the cultural heritage of Abu Dhabi.

ADACH presents AI Ain Oasis at International Planning Congress in Kenya

ADACH participated in the 46th Annual Congress of the International Society of City and Regional Planners (ISOCARP), in Nairobi, Kenya. From 19th till 23rd September ADACH was represented with the paper presentation titled 'Master Planning for Heritage Conservation in Al Ain Oasis, UAE', made by Ege Yildirim, Heritage Planner at the ADACH Strategic Planning and Development Department. As a rich case study of heritage planning practice in Abu Dhabi, the Al Ain Oasis Cultural Quarter Master Plan (AAOCQMP) was presented within the Workshop on 'The impact of spatial planning, urban design and built form on urban sustainability'. The paper focused on the AAOCQMP, but also used this theme as a medium for discussing more general issues of heritage planning encountered while implementing the ADACH mission and strategies. The theme of the 46th ISOCARP Congress was Sustainable City – Developing World, where delegates explored the roles of spatial planning and urban design for sustainability; tensions between environmental sustainability, economic efficiency and social equity. Five big ideas were identified for achieving sustainable cities, defined as Integration; Resilience; Economic growth; Dialogue with Traditional urban design and built form; and finally Flexibility and Adaptability of planning instruments.



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Building Conservation and Environmental Awareness

ADACH between historic buildings' conservation and environmental safety

Asbestos is a naturally occurring mineral that looks like long white fibers. Although it has been used for centuries as an additive in construction materials for its resistance to heat, electrical and chemical damage, the inhalation of asbestos has been found to cause acute health problems. In the past few decades, asbestos has been banned from new construction; strict regulations have been put into place for the systematic removal - or abatement - of asbestos in the case of building demolition or renovations. Many of the historic buildings that are being conserved by ADACH have been used and inhabited until recently. The traditional building materials typically of mud and mortar were modified and very often, asbestos was introduced particularly when roofs were replaced and modern plumbing was installed. As ADACH is responsible for environmental safety and occupational health within the scope of its conservation initiatives, ADACH has taken the necessary precautions to deal with asbestos prior to any intervention at these cultural resources. UNITED In July 2010, the Conservation Department began its emergency conservation tasks at the house of Ahmed bin Hilal AI Dhahiri, which is located to the south of AI Jimi Oasis in Al Ain city. The building presented structural issues with bowing walls and large cracks in the ceiling. The ceiling contained asbestos and asbestos waste was littered throughout the site, thus preventing any interventions

until environmental safety was ensured.

A consulting firm specialized in the environmental field was invited to evaluate the building and develop a protocol to ensure the conservation team's safety during intervention. The firm trained ADACH workers and supervisors in asbestos awareness which included a lecture on asbestos and its risks and demonstrations on how to avoid contamination. The workers and conservation supervisors were awarded certificates for their successful completion of the asbestos awareness training course.

The conservation team implemented these safety procedures to undertake the emergency conservation program at Ahmed bin Hilal AI Dhahiri House. Prior to interventions, the asbestos debris around the site was removed by a special contractor. The fixed asbestos on the ceiling which was considered a low hazard was monitored periodically. The daily level of airborne asbestos was recorded daily. Conservation interventions included supporting the walls, ceilings and doorways with scaffold propping, injecting liquid mortar within cracks to fill voids, and reinforcing damaged wall bases in some of the rooms and along the facades. ADACH is now following the protocol established at Bin Hilal house at other buildings where asbestos is present within the scope of our conservation activities.

ADACH reaps many awards at the Sharjah Book Fair

The Abu Dhabi Authority for Culture and Heritage (ADACH) reaped many awards at the twenty-ninth edition of the Sharjah International Book Fair last month.

The Sharjah Book Fair 2010 was inaugurated by His Highness Sheikh Dr. Sultan bin Mohammed Al Qasimi, UAE Supreme Council Member and Ruler of Sharjah, on 26th October. ADACH presented a number of cultural projects at the Fair, including: Sheikh Zayed Book Award; Kalima translation project; Qalam project, for publishing the creative works of young Emiratis; KITAB, the joint venture between ADACH and the Frankfurt International Book Fair; Poetry Academy and the Abu Dhabi International Book Fair.

The National Library of ADACH displayed a collection of its recent publications in the fields of literature and the sciences. It also had a display of Qalam's publications. Two of the books that have been published by ADACH won awards at the Sharjah International Book Fair. Dr. Fatima Hamad Al Mazrouei's book, "Monafarat in Pre-Islamic Literature", won the award for Best UAE Book in the Field of Studies.

The book's introduction outlines the aim of the study: to address Monafarat (prose quarrels) in pre-Islamic literature in order to increase levels of understanding about this form of literature. It identifies the causes, origins, elements, components and overall impact of Monafarat on pre-Islamic literature.


The author also discusses how the participants behaved during these quarrels - including elders, priests, poets and orators – and looks at what actions they actually took to resolve disputes, specifically the way in which they were governed and arbitrated.

This study demonstrates the values that are important to Arabs, that they are willing to fight for. It shows how some of the conflicts that began between individuals degenerated into conflicts between tribes, or developed into internal tribal disputes. It also looks at the types of Monafarat taking place in the markets and at the festivals in the region.

The second book is entitled "The Poetry of Kaab bin Maadan Al Ashqari" and was written by Ahmed Mohammed Obaid. The book won the award for the Best Book by a UAE Author. The author of "The Poetry of Kaab bin Maadan Al Ashqari" is the Emirati researcher Ahmed Mohamed Obaid. He was born in Oman in the first century of the Islamic calendar, and he is a renowned Umayyad-era poet.

A comprehensive collection of Ashqari's poetry has not yet been gathered in one book. His work is scattered throughout a number of sources, according to the author. Thus, this book is the first scientifically documented collection of Ashqari's complete works.





The Emirates Photography Competition will launch its sixth session in 2011

The Abu Dhabi Authority for Culture and Heritage (ADACH) announced that it would be organising the sixth session of the Emirates Photography Competition in 2011. It will be held under the auspices of the International Federation of Photographic Art (FIAP) for the second consecutive year. The main theme for this session is 'Black and White through Creative Eyes'. The Competition has different themes each year, and this directs photographers towards new ideas and visions, and aspires to opening new photographic horizons for the contestants. There are also four other themes, and these change from year to year.

This year, the Competition celebrates the famous US photographer Ansel Adams (1902-1984). He was one of the greatest creative people in the history of photography and was best known for his dazzling and magical black-and-white photographs, which are still making a great impact on the photographic world to date. The 'Black and White' theme focuses on Adams' works and is a tribute to the importance of his research and his photographic studies.

The Competition also honours the late photographer Noor Ali Rashid (1929-2010), one of the leading figures in the art of photography in the UAE. A special award, named after Rashid, will be given to the best Emirati photographer of 2011. The award will look for works that highlight the local environmental issues and cultural symbols of the UAE. This is in recognition of Rashid'd photographic work, which documents details of life within UAE society and its ruling families. The UAE Talent Competition will now include two age groups: sixteen to twenty-one and the under-sixteens. The theme will be 'Image of the Future', and it aims to recognize young photographic talent from around the world.

For the first time, the Competition will launch the 'Arab Image' award, where five gold medals will be awarded to the five best collections of photographs entered by participants in the sixth session. There will also be gold medals and awards for the best five groups originating from international photography associations and clubs. This will support the role that these clubs play in developing the cultural movement of photography.



The Competition prizes amount to more than 500,000 UAE dirhams, and participating works will be released in qualityprinted publications. Each participant will be given a free copy. The Competition has achieved the highest ratings since its inception, and the FIAP say that this is due to the quality of the entrants in the 'Prince of Light' competition which took place during the fifth session in 2010.

Talking about the goals of the Competition, Abdullah Al Ameri, Director of Culture and the Arts at ADACH said: "The launch of the Emirates Photography Competition aims to develop photography in the United Arab Emirates by attracting as many photographers as possible and nurturing their talents. This will be achieved through supporting our professionals by providing them with specialized workshops, interactive meetings and seminars and through holding both solo and collective exhibitions inside and outside the country. It also encourages the comprehensive acquisition and publication of photographic works in all possible ways."

"The Competition is open to photographers from around the world. It is believed that photographs have the ability to overcome various geographic barriers and cultural differences, and that the art of photography plays an active role in creating a distinct state of interaction and communication between artists and the general public. Art should be recognised, wherever it originates from," he added.

National Library News





Nuclear Energy in the Gulf By: Ecssr. Abu Dhabi : Ecssr, 2009 , 493P.

The future heralds a potential crisis in power supply in view of growing global and domestic demand for fossil fuel energy, particularly in supplying power for seawater desalination in the case of the Arabian Gulf region. The possibility of fossil fuel depletion on the one hand, and the increasing rate of development in the GCC countries on the other, has prompted Arab Gulf states to consider the development of peaceful nuclear energy as an alternative source of power generation.

In order to provide a realistic strategic review of this topic, as well as various strategies with which to guarantee its achievement and benefit from the experience of other countries, the Emirates Center for Strategic Studies and Research (ECSSR) convened its 14th Annual Energy Conference under the title "Nuclear Energy in the Gulf," on November 24–26, 2008 in Abu Dhabi, hosting a group of distinguished energy experts from various academic, professional and technical backgrounds.

This book comprises a valuable collection of the papers presented at the conference. It identifies the motives behind

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the development of peaceful nuclear energy programs in the Gulf states as well as the local and regional implications of such programs, and examines the role of nuclear energy in the context of Gulf energy security and climate change. The inherent risks and opportunities of managing nuclear power are explored through a discussion of security infrastructure, non-proliferation standards and the role of international cooperation in the field of nuclear technology and longterm development.

The book also analyzes factors pertaining to the economic viability of the nuclear energy option and its political and social implications, drawing on international experiences of existing civilian nuclear programs in other parts of the world. Examples presented in this volume include case studies of Japan and Germany, and a comparative outlook assessing the respective programs of Iran, Israel, Pakistan and India.

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



The Confession

By: John Grisham. London: Knopf Doubleday Publishing Group, 2010 .418P

Synopsis

An innocent man is about to be executed. Only a guilty man can save him.

For every innocent man sent to prison, there is a guilty one left on the outside. He doesn't understand how the police and prosecutors got the wrong man, and he certainly doesn't care. He just can't believe his good luck. Time passes and he realizes that the mistake will not be corrected: the authorities believe in their case and are determined to get a conviction. He may even watch the trial of the person wrongly accused of his crime. He is relieved when the verdict is guilty. He laughs when the police and prosecutors congratulate themselves. He is content to allow an innocent person to go to prison, to serve hard time, even to be executed.

Travis Boyette is such a man. In 1998, in the small East Texas city of Sloan, he abducted, raped, and strangled a popular high school cheerleader. He buried her body so that it would never be found, then watched in amazement as police and prosecutors arrested and convicted Donté Drumm, a local football star, and marched him off to death row.

Now nine years have passed. Travis has just been paroled in Kansas for a different crime; Donté is four days away from his execution. Travis suffers from an inoperable brain tumor. For the first time in his miserable life, he decides to do what's right and confess.

But how can a guilty man convince lawyers, judges, and politicians that they're about to execute an innocent man? The Washington Post - Maureen Corrigan

The Confession is the kind of grab-a-reader-by-the-shoulders suspense story that demands to be inhaled as quickly as possible. But it's also a superb work of social criticism in the literary troublemaker tradition of Upton Sinclair's The Jungle& For more than a decade, in his novels&and on editorial pages, Grisham has ruminated over the efficacy and morality of the death penalty. The Confession bangs the gavel and issues a clear verdict. As an advocacy thriller, it will rile some readers, shake up conventional pieties and, no doubt, change some minds. Whatever your politics, don't read this book if you just want to kick back in your recliner and relax.

Broke: The Plan to Restore Our Trust, Truth and Treasure By: Glenn Beck, Kevin Balfe. New York: Threshold Editions 2010, 416P.

Synopsis

In the words of Harvard economist Niall Ferguson, the United States is "an empire on the edge of chaos." Why? Glenn Beck thinks the answer is pretty simple: Because we've turned our backs on the Constitution.

Yes, our country is financially broke, but that's just a side effect of our broken spirit, our broken faith in government, the broken promises by our leaders, and a broken political system that has centralized power at the expense of individual rights.

There is a lot of work ahead, but we can't move forward until we first understand how we got here. Starting with the American Revolution, Glenn takes readers on an express train through 234 years of history, culminating with the Great Recession and the bipartisan recklessness of Presidents Bush and Obama. It's the history lesson we all wished we'd had in school. (Did you know, for example, that FDR once made a key New Deal policy decision based on his lucky number?) Along the way, you'll see how everything you thought you knew about the political parties is a lie, how Democrats and Republicans alike used to fight for minimum government and maximum freedom, and how both parties have been taken over by a cancer called "progressivism." By the end, you'll understand why no president, no congress and no court can fix this problem alone. Looking toward them for answers is like looking toward the ocean for drinking water— it looks promising, but the end result is catastrophic.

After revealing the trail of lies that brought us here, Broke exposes the truth about what we're really facing. Most people have seen pieces of the puzzle, but very few have ever seen the whole picture — and for very good reason: Our leaders have done everything in their power to hide it. If Americans understood how dire things really are, they would be demanding radical reform right now. Despite the rhetoric, that's not the kind of change our politicians really believe in. Finally, Broke provides the hope that comes with knowing the truth. Once you see what we're really up against, it's much easier to develop a realistic plan. To fix ourselves financially, Glenn argues, we have to fix ourselves first. That means some serious introspection and, ultimately, a series of actions that will unite all Americans around the concept of shared sacrifice. After all, this generation may not be asked to storm




beaches, but we are being asked to do something just as critical to preserving freedom.

Packed with great stories from history, chalkboard-style teachable moments, custom illustrations, and Glenn Beck's trademark combination of entertainment and enlightenment, Broke makes the case that when you're traveling in the wrong direction, slight course corrections won't cut it—you need to take drastic action. Through a return to individual rights, an uncompromising adherence to the Constitution, and a complete rethinking about the role of government in a free society, Glenn exposes the idea of "transformation" for the progressive smokescreen that it is, and instead builds a compelling case that restoration is the only way forward.




Follett takes you to a Mario Vargas Llosa's classic early novel takes place in a Peruvian town, situated between desert and jungle, which is torn by boredom and lust. Don Anselmo, a stranger in a black coat, builds a brothel on the outskirts of the town while he charms its innocent people, setting in motion a chain reaction with extraordinary consequences. This brothel, called the Green House, brings together the innocent and the corrupt: Bonificia, a young Indian girl saved by the nuns only to become a prostitute; Father Garcia, struggling for the church; and four best friends drawn to both excitement and escape.

The conflicting forces that haunt the Green House evoke a world balanced between savagery and civilization -- and one that is cursed by not being able to discern between the two. The Green House - Chapter One

The sergeant takes a look at Sister Patrocinio and the botfly is still there. The launch is pitching on the muddy waters, between two walls of trees that give off a burning, sticky mist. Huddled under the canopy, stripped to the waist, the soldiers are asleep, with the greenish, yellowish noonday sun above: Shorty's head is lying on Fats's stomach, Blondy is breathing in short bursts, Blacky has his mouth open and is grunting. A thin shadow of gnats is escorting the launch, and butterflies, wasps, horseflies take shape among the bodies. The motor is snoring evenly, it chokes, it snores, and Nieves the pilot is holding the rudder in his left hand as he uses his right to smoke with, and his face, deeply tanned, is unchanging under his straw hat. These savages weren't normal, why didn't they sweat like other people? Sitting stiffly in the stem, Sister Angêlica has her eyes closed, there are at least a thousand wrinkles on her face, sometimes she sticks out the tip of her tongue, licks the sweat from her upper lip, and spits. Poor old woman, she wasn't up to these chores. The botfly moves its blue little wings, softly pushes off from Sister Patrocinio's flushed forehead, is lost as it circles off into the white light, and the pilot goes to turn off the motor, they were getting there, Sergeant, Chicais was beyond that gorge. But he was telling the good Sergeant that there wouldn't be anybody there. The sound of the engine stops, the nuns and the soldiers open their eyes, raise their heads, look around. Standing up, Nieves the pilot moves the rudder pole from left to right, the launch silently approaches the shore, the soldiers get up, put on their shirts, their caps, fasten their leggings. The vegetable palisade on the right bank suddenly opens up beyond the bend in the river and there is a rise, a brief parenthesis of reddish earth that descends to a tiny inlet of mud, pebbles, reeds, and ferns. There is no canoe on



the bank, no human figure on the top of the rise. The boat runs aground. Nieves and the soldiers jump out, slosh in the lead-colored mud. A cemetery, a person's feelings could always tell, the Mangaches were right. The Sergeant leans over the prow, the pilot and the soldiers drag the launch up onto dry land. They should help the sisters, make a hand chair for them so they wouldn't get wet. Sister Angêlica is very serious as she sits on the arms of Blacky and Fats, Sister Patrocinio hesitates as Shorty and Blondy put their hands together to receive her, and as she lets herself down, she turns red as a shrimp. The soldiers stagger across the shore and put the nuns down where the mud ends. The Sergeant jumps out, reaches the foot of the hill, and Sister Angêlica is already climbing resolutely up the slope, followed by Sister Patrocinio, both are using their hands, they disappear among clouds of red dust. The soil on the hill is soft, it gives way with every step, the Sergeant and the soldiers go forward, sinking to their knees, hunched over, smothered in the dust, Fats is sneezing and spitting and holds his handkerchief over his mouth. At the top, they all brush off their uniforms and the Sergeant looks around: a circular clearing, a handful of huts with conical roofs, small plots of cassava and bananas, and thick undergrowth all around. Among the huts, small trees with oval-shaped pockets hanging from the branches: paucar nests. He had told her, Sister Angêlica, here was the proof, not a soul, now they could see for themselves. But Sister Angêlica is walking around, she goes into a but, comes out and sticks her head into the next one, shoos away the flies by clapping her hands, does not stop for a second, and in that way, seen from a distance, hazy in the dust, she is not an old woman but a walking habit, erect, an energetic shadow. Sister



Patrocinio, on the other hand, does not move, her hands are hidden in her habit, and her eyes run back and forth over the empty village. A few branches shake and shrieks are heard, a squadron of green wings, black beaks, and blue breasts flies noisily over the deserted huts of Chicais, the soldiers and the nuns follow them with their eyes until the jungle swallows them up, the shrieking lasts for a momenEEEEEE. Arabian Writer - Tahar Ben Jelloun

Tahar Ben Jelloun (born in Fes, Morocco, 1 December 1944) is a Moroccan poet and writer. The entirety of his work is written in French, although his first language is Arabic.

After attending a bilingual (Arabic-French) elementary school, Ben Jalloun studied French in Tangier, Morocco until he was 18 years old. He continued his studies in philosophy at Mohammed-V University in Rabat, where he composed his first poems (collected in Hommes sous linceul de silence (1971).

After this point, he worked as a professor in Morocco, teaching philosophy first in Tetouan and then in Casablanca. However, he left Morocco in 1971 after the arabization of the philosophy department, unable or unwilling to teach in Arabic. He moved to Paris to continue his studies in psychology, and began to write more extensively.

Starting in 1972, he began to write articles and reviews for the French newspaper [Le Monde], and in 1975 he received his doctorate in social psychiatry. Using his experience with psychotherapy as both a reference and an inspiration, he wrote the book La Réclusion solitaire in 1976. ATION In 1985 he published the novel "L'Enfant de sable," which was widely celebrated. He won the Prix Goncourt in 1987 for his novel La Nuit Sacrée.

In 1997 he saw his novel Le Racisme expliqué à ma fille published, wherein he "explains racism to his daughter," using his family as inspiration for his novels. Ben Jalloun is regularly asked to give speeches and lectures at universities worldwide - both in Morocco, and all over Europe. In 2004 he was awarded the International IMPAC Dublin Literary Award for This Blinding Absence of Light (translated from the French by Linda Coverdale). He was rewarded the Prix Ulysse in 2005 for the entirety of his work


In September 2006, he was awarded a special prize for "peace and friendship between people" at Lazio between Europe and the Mediterranean Festival.[1]

On 1 February 2008, Nicolas Sarkozy awarded him the Cross of Grand Officer of the Légion d'honneur.

Ben Jelloun is married and father of 4 children. He lives in Paris.

In his novel, Leaving Tangier, Ben Jelloun writes about a Moroccan brother and sister who leave their impoverished home in search of better lives in Spain. This novel sheds a cold light on a side of North African life that is often overlooked and at times unimaginable; he is unflinching in his commitment to expose the sacrifice and pain inherent in the struggle to rise above poverty and move within the Western world. Leaving Tangier centers on the paths of Azel and his sister, Kenza, as they seek to reinvent their lives, in Barcelona, and how their paths diverge once they get there. Each sibling's ambition rests in the hands of Miguel, a mysterious wealthy older Spaniard, and a man generous and loving one moment, demanding and cruel the next. Miguel's power lies in what he can offer the siblings—and in what he can take away His novels L'Enfant de sable and






